- Hope you like them 😊



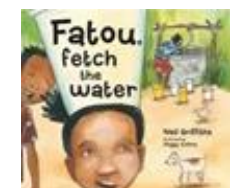
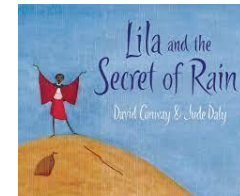

Name and locate the seven continents of the world. Africa, Antarctica, Asia, Australasia, Europe, North America and South America.

Can I describe the difference between a place in England and a place in Africa? Climate, food, traditions, animals, culture, homes.

Name and locate the five oceans of the world. Arctic, Atlantic, Pacific, Indian and the Southern

Can I name the four countries that make up the United Kingdom? England, Wales, Scotland, Northern Ireland

Name the four points of a compass. North, South, East and West

Can I name the 4 capital cities that make up the United Kingdom? London, Edinburgh, Cardiff, Belfast,

Locate the equator and poles.

Can I name key human features linked to a location? e.g. 'church', 'farm', 'shop', 'house', 'factory'

Can I name key physical features linked to a location? e.g. 'river', 'forest', 'hill', 'mountain', 'soil', 'valley', 'vegetation'.
