As Geographers we will:

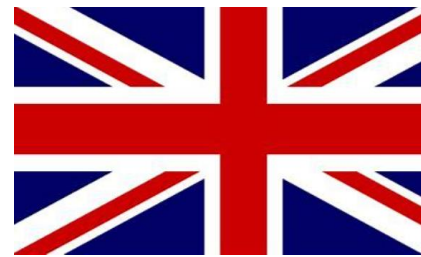
Locate the UK on a map and name it's 4 countries.
